


NSW CRIMINAL COURTS SNAPSHOT

Court workload




- In 2019, NSW criminal courts finalised 352,810 charges against 138,215 defendants. That is 6,990 more defendants than in 2015 (up 5.3%) but 1,865 fewer than in 2018.
- ❖ In 2019, 90.4% of defendants were found guilty of at least one charge.

- ❖ Most of the growth in persons with finalised matters since 2015 has come from the categories of:
 - Offences against justice procedures (e.g. breaches of court orders) (an additional 2,884 persons)
 - Acts intended to cause injury (an additional 1,745 persons)
 - Illicit drug offences (an additional 1,723 persons)
 - Weapons/explosive offences (an additional 794 persons)
 - Theft and related offences (an additional 575 persons)

Sentencing




- The most common principal penalty imposed by the NSW Criminal Courts in 2019 was a fine (33% received this penalty), followed by a non-custodial community based order, such as a community corrections order or a conditional release order with conviction (26%).
- The number of offenders sentenced to supervision in the community has increased by 56% between 2015 and 2019, up 9,812, from 17,660 to 27,472.
- Between 2015 and 2019, the annual number of convicted offenders receiving a custodial penalty (prison or juvenile detention) rose from 12,380 to 12,524, an increase of 1 per cent.

Court delay

- In the NSW District Court, median days from arrest to finalisation rose 13% from 470 days in 2015 to 529 days in 2019.
- In the NSW Local Court, the median days from arrest to finalisation rose 6% from 81 days in 2015 to 86 days in 2019.

Bail refusal rates



Since 2015 the proportion of defendants bail refused when they appeared in court increased by 1.2 percentage points, from 6.8% in 2015 (or 8,833 defendants) to 7.7% in 2019 (10,565).
