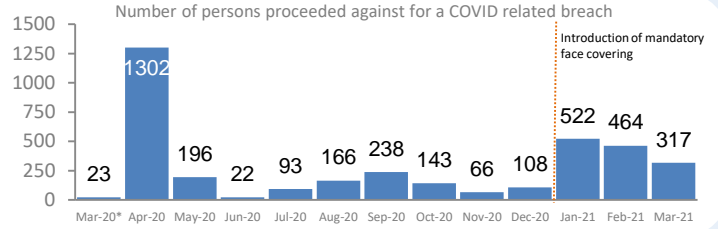


Persons proceeded against by NSW Police Force for a COVID related breach of the Public Health Act 2010: March 2020* to March 2021



Between March 2020 and March 2021, **3,660 persons** were proceeded against by NSW Police for a COVID related breach of the Public Health Act 2010.

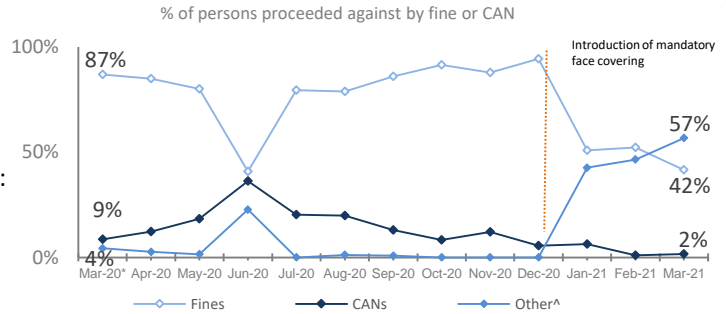


Method of proceeding by NSW police force

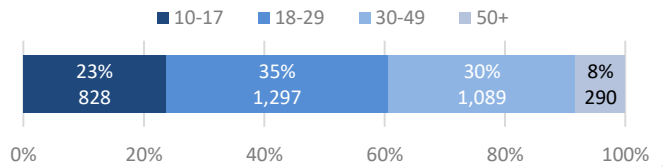
- Infringement notice (Fine): **2,635 persons**
- Court attendance notice (CAN): **358 persons**
- Warning, Caution or Youth Justice Conference (Other): **663 persons aged 10-17**

Age of persons proceeded against

- The majority of persons proceeded against for COVID related breaches are adults aged **18-29 (1,297 persons or 35%)**.
- **80% (666)** of breaches by persons **10-17 years** were issued from January to March 2021. **615** were dealt with by way of Warning, Caution or Youth Justice Conference.

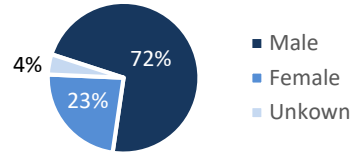


Age of persons proceeded against for a COVID related breach

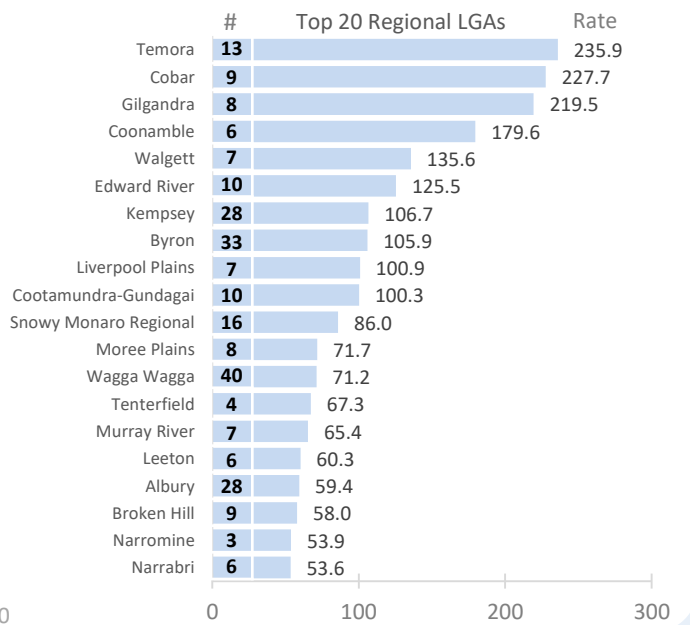
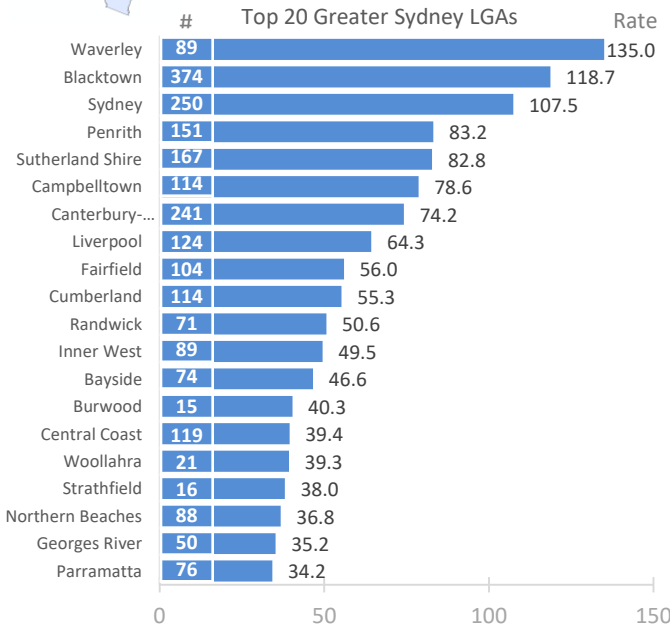


2,647 males compared to **855 females** have been proceeded against for COVID related breaches.

Within Greater Sydney, **Waverly LGA** has had the highest rate of residents proceeded against for a breach of the Public Health Act. Within Regional NSW, **Temora LGA** has had the highest rate of proceedings.



* COVID related breaches of the Public Health Act commenced on 17 March 2020 in conjunction with the implementation of isolation measures.
