


Persons proceeded against by NSW Police Force for a COVID related breach of the Public Health Act 2010: March 2020* to March 2021



Between March 2020 and March 2021, 3,660 persons were proceeded against by NSW Police for a COVID related breach of the Public Health Act 2010.







Method of proceeding by NSW police force

- Infringement notice (Fine): 2,635 persons
- Court attendance notice (CAN): 358 persons
- Warning, Caution or Youth Justice Conference (Other): 663 persons aged 10-17

Age of persons proceeded against


- The majority of persons proceeded against for COVID related breaches are adults aged 18-29 (1,297 persons or 35%).
- 80% (666) of breaches by persons 10-17 years were issued from January to March 2021. 615 were dealt with by way of Warning, Caution or Youth Justice Conference.








2,647 males compared to 855 females have been proceeded against for COVID related breaches.





Within Greater Sydney, Waverly LGA has had the highest rate of residents proceeded against for a breach of the Public Health Act. Within Regional NSW, Temora LGA has had the highest rate of proceedings.
